A Reason to Celebrate!

May 1st – School Principal Day

Janet Dellaria, a teacher from Michigan, backed by many teachers associations, decided to dedicate a day to celebrate these educational leaders of schools and spread awareness of the importance of their role.

<u>May 5th – School Lunch Hero Day</u>

School Lunch Hero Day was created by a partnership between the School Nutrition Association, and children's author Jarrett Krosoczka—the author of a number of picture books including the "Lunch Lady" series. The first day this holiday was celebrated was on May 4, 2012, and it's a day that's been celebrated on the first Friday in May every year since.

May 5th – Cinco De Mayo

Cinco de Mayo, or the fifth of May, is a holiday that celebrates the date of the Mexican army's May 5, 1862 victory over France at the Battle of Puebla during the Franco-Mexican War.

<u>May 16th – National Barbeque</u> <u>Day</u>

The origins of barbecue seem to lay with the indigenous Haitians encountered by the Spanish when Columbus first arrived.

May 29th – Memorial Day

Memorial Day is an American holiday, observed on the last Monday of May, honoring the men and women who died while serving in the U.S. military

World Milk Day was first designated by the FAO in 2001. June 1 was chosen as the date because many countries were already celebrating a milk day during that time of year. The Day provides an opportunity to focus attention on milk and raise awareness of dairy's part in healthy diets, responsible food production, and supporting livelihoods and communities.
